

California Proposition 65 Statement

Proposition 65, also known as the Safe Drinking Water and Toxic Enforcement Act of 1968, requires businesses to give a "clear and reasonable" warning label to Californians before exposing them to any of the listed chemicals, which can be found at: oehha.ca.gov/proposition-65/chemicals, known to the state of California to cause cancer or reproductive harm.

Effective from August 30, 2018, a new law requires businesses to provide "clear and reasonable" warning label on products that can expose you to specified chemical(s) known to cause cancer, birth defects and/or reproductive harm. This warning label needs to be provided prior to or during the purchase of products.

"OEHHA" has established "safe harbor levels" or levels that trigger the warning label for some, but not all, listed chemicals. Exposure below those levels do not require a warning label.

Preferred Nation is committed to conducting its business in a socially responsible and ethical manner by providing products that meet all applicable local and federal laws. Over the years, we have worked with our supply chains to implement a program that requires all material used to be original for our products. This ensures that our quality is superior and stays in compliance with Prop 65 requirements. All the inks used for decoration and printing used on Preferred

Nation products are decorated in the USA and have been tested for Prop 65 compliance.
